#### 3.0 NEW BUSINESS

- 3.1 Single School Start Time Discussion
  - 3.1.1 Jim O'Rourke
    - 3.1.1.1 The research on moving to a single start time is very compelling
      - 3.1.1.1.1 Looking at students who have more mental health issues that they have to deal with
      - 3.1.1.1.2 Research shows that students are not functioning at their best early in the morning
    - 3.1.1.2 Out of all the schools in NH surveyed, 4% of them in the state started before 7:30am.
      - 3.1.1.2.1 More schools are moving to a later start time, we are still in the 1% -2% that still start before 7:46 am.
    - 3.1.1.3 Primary reason to move to a single start
      - 3.1.1.3.1 Students' well being
    - 3.1.1.4 Students are asking for this they want a later start time
- 3.2 Concerns
  - 3.2.1 Sports
    - 3.2.1.1 Students are already leaving classes early for sporting events
    - 3.2.1.2 Looking at scheduling options to optimize class time
  - 3.2.2 Question
    - 3.2.2.1 Atkins
      - 3.2.2.1.1 If we move to a later time, won't we have the same issues just later in the morning?

- 3.2.2.1.1.1 No, this is more about the students
  - biological clock. The students who were late before, will probably still be tardy
- 3.2.2.2 Mills
  - 3.2.2.2.1 Need to keep in mind the Homework load
    - 3.2.2.2.1.1 Kids need to decompress.
    - 3.2.2.2.1.2 other activities at home in the evening.
- 3.3 We are currently on a one year extension contract that is almost up3.3.1 Will be putting this out to bid
- 3.4 Cost to Washington
  - 3.4.1 \$88,000 per bus for Washington, and we would need two
- 3.5 Logistics
  - 3.5.1 Looking at options
    - 3.5.1.1 Switching the elementary start time?
  - 3.5.2 Expect to have two companies bidding for the new contract.
    - 3.5.2.1 Hope to be able to get a competitive rate Maybe a savings
    - 3.5.2.2 Opportunity to add a 6 year age limit to all the buses to the contract
- 3.6 First bell would move to 8:I5am and last bell would move to 3:10 pm
- 3.7 Need to look at what the impact on the Elementary School students3.7.1 Need the research
- 3.8 Nothing will happen if we do not build it into the budget
  - 3.8.1 Will be on the SAU Board agenda for the December 5th meeting

    - 4.1.1 Supports the idea
    - 4.1.2 Did not realize it would be happening so soon
    - 4.1.3 The cost is really high for Washington
    - 4.1.4 Moving Elementary start time up
      - 4.1.4.1 Feels it would be fair to the staff lots of charges in the last few years
    - 4.1.5 If we made the Elementary School start earlier, how will that affect our art collaboration with other schools?
      - 4.1.5.1 The timing will line up better
    - 4.1.6 Feels it is too early for little kids to stand outside
    - 4.1.7 Potential magnet stop ?
      - 4.1.7.1 Estimated cost of this?
        - 4.1.7.1.1 Waiting for the bus companies to bid
  - 4.2 Belanger
    - 4.2.1 If we do add the \$180,000 to the budget, and it gets voted down, How can we do this and still keep transportation in the budget?
      - 4.2.1.1 Looking at how to do this
      - 4.2.1.2 The bid will be for both Washington and HD combined
        - 4.2.1.2.1 Hopes this will save money for both districts
      - 4.2.1.3 There is no room in the budget for cuts to be made to cover the extra transportation costs
    - 4.2.2 Bus schedule
      - 4.2.2.1 Students getting off the bus later
      - 4.2.2.2 May not work with families schedules
    - 4.2.3 Having the single start time additional bus costs be a warrant article?
      - 4.2.3.1 One way to do it, but it could be voted down
        - 4.2.3.1.1 No means no
  - 4.3 Mills

- 4.3.1 Sees the impact of her kids getting up early
- 4.3.2 Washington is most impacted due to the distance needed to travel to the MS and HS
- 4.3.3 There is no option for Washington students to have a late bus for those who have to stay after school.
