Program Overview

The Hillsboro-Deering Middle School
Alternative Education Program is
designed to support students who are
identified with emotional disabilities
and who require significant support in
order to make progress, access
general education classes and
activities as much as possible, and
achieve success.

Students receive their education in the setting that allows for the greatest possible access to the grade-level general education curriculum with the fewest possible restrictions (called the "least restrictive environment"). The amount of time students spend in the Program is based on individual needs. For example, students may access the Program when needing an alternative work area, when receiving instruction, or when receiving support to de-escalate and process difficult situations.

Behavioral Supports

The Alternative Education Program uses a trauma-informed behavior analysis approach to understand the purpose of student behavior and the situations that trigger and reinforce problematic behaviors. Staff are then able to design and implement interventions to support students' needs while providing opportunities for growth and stability.

Students receive individual and/or group interventions that are designed to target many skills, including:

- Understanding learning needs
 - ♦ Self-advocacy
- Working and playing in groups
- Understanding others' perspectives
- Managing emotions and behaviors
 - Organizing belongings
- Tracking and completing assignments
 - Setting and reaching goals
 - Making compromises
 - Solving peer conflicts
 - Communicating with others
